1. What is ECSA?

- Est. 1965 Brussels
- Spokesman of the European Shipowners towards the EU Institutions
- **2** 40% of the world merchant fleet



2. CO2 emission reduction – Overall context

- Expected increased demand for maritime transport
- Cost of fuel a strong incentive
- MBM EU Commission reservation



3. CO2 Emission monitoring – an EU perspective (1/3)

- EU Strategy: Stepwise approach for integrating maritime emissions into EU's policy for reducing EU GHG emissions
- EC Legislative Proposal
 - Introduce a legal framework for collecting and publishing verified annual data, as from 2018
 - ➤ Align MRV with developments in IMO on efficiency standards for existing ships



3. CO2 Emission monitoring – an EU perspective (2/3)

ECSA Position

- Contribution towards finding an appropriate global solution for CO2 monitoring from international shipping
- Mandatory requirements to be agreed upon at IMO in order to secure a globally harmonised system



3. CO2 Emission monitoring – an EU perspective (3/3)

- EU Parliament and Council Legislative Process
 - ➤ EP position adopted Excluding controversial elements
 - Ongoing debates in Council
 - Compromise agreement between EP and Council delayed by EU election process – Buy time to IMO to further develop global data collection system



4. Fuel consumption monitoring - an global prospective

- IMO mandatory efficiency standards for newbuild ships (EEDI) and energy management plan (SEEMP)
- Further measures needed to reduce emissions: collection of fuel consumption data from individual ships as a first step
- IMO MEPC66 Concrete developments





5. Conclusion

- Consistency with IMO efforts must be ensured
- Focus on collecting useful data in an efficient and flexible way
- Golden opportunity for the EU to play a proactive role in IMO



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
